

Coming in January... A Bible Study on the Mass

In 2021 the bishops of the United States announced a plan that centers on the theme 'Created Anew by the Body and Blood of Christ, Source of our Healing and Hope.' A key priority of this plan focuses on a National Eucharistic Revival with the goal of renewing the Catholic Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. To kick off this movement, Saint Marianne Cope Parish will offer a Bible Study on The Mass.

The Mass is nothing short of amazing. Through it, we encounter God in the most intimate way possible as we hear Him speak to us in the Liturgy of the Word and as we receive Him Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist.

The words, the gestures, and the rituals of the Mass are rich in meaning. Everything we say and do in the Liturgy is steeped in biblical language. *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass* explores the extraordinary biblical roots of the Liturgy and reveals what it all means and why it all matters. This fascinating tour of the Mass will renew your faith and deepen your love for and devotion to the Holy Eucharist.

Two sessions will be offered. On Wednesday, mornings at 10:00 a.m. beginning on January 18, 2023 and Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. beginning on January 19, 2023. Meetings will be held in Saint Philip Church Hall and coffee and refreshments will be provided. The cost of the materials is \$26.95 and pre-registration is required. On January 23rd, we celebrate the Feast Day of our patron Saint, Marianne Cope. On the weekend of January 22-23 all the Masses will be celebrated in honor of St. Marianne Cope so that the majority of parishioners can celebrate together.

On January 29th we will celebrate her in St. Philip Hall after the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

St. Marianne Cope was born Barbara Koob in Heppenheim, Germany in 1838 and died on August 9, 1918 in Hawaii after ministering for many long years to the Lepers.

She came to the United States with her parents as an infant settling in Utica, New York. As a young woman, she worked in a textile factory to support her family. Later she entered the Franciscan Sisters in Syracuse, NY. Invested with the religious habit, she was given the name, "Marianne." Sister Marianne ministered to the German-speaking immigrants who came to the United States in copious numbers around 1848.
