

Lenten Meditation from Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274)

"One of the soldiers with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water." (Jn. 19:14) Deliberately, the Gospel says "opened" not wounded; because through Our Lord's' side the gates of heaven were opened to eternal life. "(Apoc. 4:19") After these things I looked, behold a gate was opened in heaven." Immediately there came forth blood and water. How miraculous! From a dead body, in which blood congeals, blood should come forth.

By the Passion of Christ, we receive full absolution of every sin and every stain. We receive this absolution from sin through that blood that is the price of our redemption.

The water and the blood may be thought of in relation to two sacraments: Baptism (water) and Holy Eucharist (blood). Actually, both may be referred to the Holy Eucharist since in the Mass water is mixed with wine.

From the side of Christ, asleep in death on the cross, there flowed that <u>blood</u> and <u>water</u> in which the Church is consecrated, so from the side of sleeping Adam was formed the first woman, who herself foreshadowed the church.
