

Eucharistic Hymns written by St. Thomas Aquinas (1224-1274

O Salutaris Hostia Tantum Ergo Sacramentum O Sacrum Conviviun Pange Lingua Adoro Te Devote

O Salutaris is sung when the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar for Adoration. In English its title is: O Saving Victim. Tantum Ergo Sacramentum is sung just before Benediction. Its English title is: Down in Adoration Falling.

<u>Pange Lingua</u> is sung in procession on Holy Thursday. Its English title is: <u>Sing My Tongue the Savior's Glory. Adoro Te Devote</u> is sung in various times for Communion. Its English title is: Humbly We Adore Thee.

Just to think that St. Thomas Aquinas lived in the 13 century and these hymns are still as prevalent now as they were then.

Corpus Christi

The Feast of Corpus Christi will be celebrated this year on June 11th. Corpus Christi translated from the Latin means:" The Body of Christ." In reality it is the celebration of The Body and Blood of Christ. Archbishop Blair has asked each parish in the Archdiocese of Hartford to have a Eucharistic/Corpus Christi Procession which demonstrates our belief in Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist, after the priest consecrates the bread and wine. The procession will take place on the outside of the Church, in which three Altars will be visited with benediction at each Altar. Solemn Benediction will take place at the main Altar in the Church.

Mass in Honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Solemnity of The Sacred Heart of Jesus falls on June 17, 2023. There will be a Mass celebrated at <u>St. Catherine of Siena Church</u> at 9 am. Normally masses are not celebrated on Friday. Honoring the importance of this Solemnity and its devotion and message of Mercy may bring many graces to those who attend.
