

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As announced in Rome on June 26, Pope Francis has appointed, at my request, a Coadjutor Archbishop for Hartford, Bishop Christopher Coyne, Bishop of Burlington, Vermont.

Bishop Coyne's appointment as coadjutor means that upon my retirement next year after I reach the canonical retirement age of 75 he will succeed me as your Archbishop.

I made this request of Pope Francis in a letter I sent to him dated January 24 of this year. With the passing of years and my own retirement age approaching, I told Pope Francis that the appointment of a coadjutor bishop would not only be helpful to me for the pastoral care of the Archdiocese, but would also provide my successor with time to become familiar with the Archdiocese, its clergy and people, and with our ongoing pastoral planning, before becoming Archbishop.

I should add that a request for the appointment of a coadjutor bishop is not unprecedented, as we saw recently in the Diocese of Providence, Rhode Island, with the appointment of Bishop Henning as coadjutor to succeed Bishop Tobin.

I am grateful to Pope Francis for granting my request and to Bishop Coyne for accepting this appointment from the Holy Father. I first met Bishop Coyne in 2011 and we have worked together as members of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. His years of ministry as a priest and bishop speak for themselves, and our Archdiocese will be blest to have him as chief shepherd when the time comes. I know we will give him a warm welcome.

Bishop Coyne will take up residence in the Archdiocese with a Mass of Welcome to be celebrated at Cathedral of Saint Joseph, Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Hartford, on Monday, October 9, 2023, at 2 PM.

As for me, my 75th birthday, God willing, will be April 12, 2024. I hope with divine assistance to continue to fulfill my responsibilities faithfully, now ably assisted by both Coadjutor Archbishop Coyne and Bishop Betancourt.

<u>Happy 4th of July</u>

The 4th of July this year falls on Tuesday. Please note that our hours are shortened this week. <u>Our</u> <u>office will only be open on Wednesday and</u> <u>Thursday, July 5 & 6. We will be closed on July</u> <u>3, 4 and 7th; Monday, Tuesday (holiday) and Friday.</u>

Thomas Jefferson was quite reluctant, at first to write the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Just married to his new wife Rachel and only 33 years old, he yearned to be in Virginia at his home named, Monticello. There he could farm the land and continue building his home. With the help of Benjamin Franklin and John Adams he completed it by July2, 1776. However, it could not be read publicly until all the colonies ratified it. By July 4th it was ratified and the Declaration was read from the balcony of Independence Hall for the first time by Thomas Jefferson to scores of people gathered below. When the Declaration was read we were already in the Revolutionary War, which began in Massachusetts on April 19, 1775. This is America's most sacred holiday. The second is close to it. It is Thanksgiving Day, solidified by President Abraham Lincoln (1861-1865) as the last Thursday of November. Incidentally, the Constitution of the United States was ratified in 1787, except for the State of Rhode Island. Rhode Island did ratify the Constitution on its 200th anniversary in 1987. On behalf of our parish staff and myself, we wish everyone a very safe, healthy, happy Independence Day...the 4th of July.
