

# Welcome to the New Coadjutor Archbishop of Hartford

We welcome to the Archdiocese of Hartford our new coadjutor Archbishop, His Excellency, Most Rev. Christopher J. Coyne (pronounced: coin) who is presently the Bishop of Burlington, VT.

It was announced on Monday, June 26, 2023, that Bishop Coyne has been assigned by Pope Francis as coadjutor Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Hartford until the official retirement of Archbishop Blair. The coadjutor Archbishop automatically becomes Archbishop upon the retirement of the present Archbishop. Archbishop Coyne will be officially welcomed to the Archdiocese of Hartford as coadjutor Archbishop with a Mass of welcome on October 9, 2023 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. At that time, Archbishop Coyne is not the Archbishop of Hartford. He is a coadjutor Archbishop until Archbishop Blair formally retires next year (2024).

Upon Archbishop Blair's retirement Archbishop Coyne becomes Hartford's sixth Archbishop and the dioceses' 14<sup>th</sup> bishop. The Diocese of Hartford was erected on March 19, 1843 by His Holiness, Pope Gregory XVI. Thus St. Joseph is the Archdiocesan Patron, as March 19<sup>th</sup> is St. Joseph's Feast Day.

Archbishop Coyne will become the successor of some illustrious bishops of this august diocese. Our first Bishop, William Tyler was a convert to the Roman Catholic faith. Our third Bishop, Francis McFarland was a Math professor at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Maryland. Under Bishop McFarland Hartford became the first diocese in the United States to require a financial annual report of all the parishes. Our 4<sup>th</sup> Bishop, Thomas Galbarry was the President of Villa Nova University in Pennsylvania when he was appointed Bishop of Harford. Bishop, Michael Tierney was our 6<sup>th</sup> Bishop and the first priest of the Diocese of Harford to become its bishop. Our 10<sup>th</sup> Bishop, John F. Whealon was a renowned Scripture scholar and one of the youngest bishops of Vatican Council II and our 13<sup>th</sup> Bishop, Leonard Blair was instrumental in helping Pope St. John Paul II for four years, to ameliorate Vatican finances. At this time we welcome Archbishop Covne to the Archdiocese of Harford, as our coadjutor (pronounced: co-ajooter). Please pray for Archbishop Blair and for coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne.

## Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



### St. Anne and St. Joachim

On Wednesday, July 26, 2023 we celebrate the Feast Day of Sts. Anne and her husband, Joachim. Traditionally, they are known as the parents of Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. Actually, we are not sure of Mary's parents names. These names come to us from books we call "apocryphal". The apocryphal books were never accepted by the Church, yet they remain an integral part of our Catholic tradition. For many centuries the people celebrated this day on different dates other than July 26<sup>th</sup>. The Canon Laws of the Church tell us about "customs". In other words, because of certain "customs" among the faithful: those customs become part and parcel of the faith. The reformer Martin Luther had a great devotion to St. Anne and Mary, for that matter.

After the close of The Council of Trent in 1565, The Dominican, Michael Cardinal Ghisilieri became Pope Pius V (1566-1572). Today he is known to us as *Pope St. Pius V*. It was his task to implement The Council of Trent. Liturgically, he solidified the Feast of Sts. Anne & Joachim on July 26<sup>th</sup>. Vatican II kept it also. Thus the Feast Day of Anne and Joachim remains, from the 1560's, on July 26<sup>th</sup>.

Of course, we are aware that the French people have a great devotion to St. Anne. Some of you have probably visited St. Anne de Beaupre (St. Anne of the Meadows) in Quebec, Canada. In the Archdiocese of Harford five parishes are named in her honor. Please join us for Mass on Wednesday, July 26<sup>th</sup> at 12:10 pm The Feast Day of St. Anne. The statue of St. Anne is in our sanctuary off to the side. There is a prayer in honor of St. Anne for your taking.

The Protestant Scripture scholar William Barclay (widely accepted in Roman Catholic circles) wrote these word in 1960. They are so appropriate for our day now.

If a man consistently enough and long enough refuses to accept and to listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, then in the end he will become quite unable to recognize that guidance when it comes. That is to say, he will be quite unable to recognize truth when he sees it. That is what had happened to these scribes and Pharisees. They had so long taken their way, they had so long refused God's way, they had so consistently rejected the guidance of the Spirit, that they had brought themselves into a condition that they were totally unable to recognize truth when they were confronted with it; they had come to a state when they could call good evil and evil good. That is the sin against the Holy Spirit, for it is the consequence of consistent and continuous refusal of the guidance of the Spirit.
