

Coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne

We will welcome, to our Archdiocese, Coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne on October 9, 2023 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Conn. Archbishop Coyne came to us from the Diocese of Burlington, VT after serving there for eight years. He is a priest of the Archdiocese of Boston, MA.

Let me make this crystal clear (a favorite saying of our 37th president, Richard Nixon). We welcome coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne to the Archdiocese as coadjutor Archbishop on October 9th. HE DOES NOT BECOME THE ARCHBISHOP OF HARTFORD ON THAT DAY! Archbishop Leonard Blair remains the Archbishop of Hartford until his 75th birthday, which falls on April 12, 2024. This is in accord with Canon Law or Church law.

A "coadjutor" has the immediate right of succession. Thus on April 13, 2024 Christopher Coyne becomes the Archbishop of Hartford.

In the 180 year history of the Archdiocese it is the first time we have a coadjutor bishop. Also, in our 180 year history it remains the first time we have so many former Archbishops still living... Archbishop Daniel Cronin (1992 - 2003), Archbishop Henry Mansell (2003 - 2013), and soon to be Archbishop Leonard Blair (2013 - 2024).

A little lesson, if I may. When we say "former" we understand the person is living. If we say "late" we understand that the person is dead. So many times we hear from the media phrases such as "former president Ronald Reagan". This indicates he is still alive when he died in 2004. Properly, it is the "late" president Ronald Reagan or the "late" Archbishop John F. Whealon. How honorable it is to be proud of our language and to use it properly.

Everyone is invited to attend the welcoming Mass of coadjutor Archbishop, Christopher Coyne on Monday, October 9, 2023 at 2 PM at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford. On that day the office will be closed so that employees may attend the Mass. We pray for God's graces during this time of transition.

Labor Day

This year Labor Day falls on Monday, September 4th. In observance of Labor Day the office will be closed.

Also, Mass will be celebrated that day at 9:00 a.m. instead of 12:10 p.m. On September 4th Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. instead of 12:10 p.m. No Mass at 12:10 p.m. on September 4th.

Isn't it amazing how quickly the summer days passed. It seems like yesterday that we celebrated Mass in the cemetery for Memorial Day! We find ourselves getting ready for Fall. However, we have several weeks of summer as it begins on September 20th.

St. Jeanne Jugan (1792-1879)

In 2017, many parishes in many towns in the Archdiocese of Harford merged and received new parish names. In East Windsor we were named the parish of St.Marianne Cope. In Windsor they took on the name of St. Damien of Molakai. St. Marianne Cope was a close co-worker with St. Damien of Molakai. The Enfield churches took on the name of St. Jeanne Jugan, who is the subject of our writing today.

The Feast Day of St. Jeanne Jugan falls this week on August 30th. She was born on October 25, 1792 to Joseph and Marie Jugan during the French Revolution. She was the sixth of eight children. At the time of her birth, the French Revolution was severely suppressing Religious Orders, confiscating their properties, convents and monasteries.

At the age of three, her father was lost at sea. Her mother struggled to keep the family fed and a roof over their heads. In her 15th year she became a kitchen maid for a family that was well-off. She witnessed their care for the poor and elderly. When she turned 25 she became a nurse in the hospital of Le Rosais. She was worn out after only six years of nursing. Please remember that hospital work in her day was not what it is today. She worked in the hospital between 1817 and 1823.

With a certain Mademoiselle Lecoq she joined the third Order founded by St. John Eudes (Feast Day; August 19th) which adored Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Mlle. Lecoq and Jeanne Jugan spent hours in prayer, taught catechism to the town's children, assisted at Mass, took care of the poor and elderly women.

At the age of 45 in 1837 Jeanne rented a humble cottage and continued her work among the poor in the City of Saint Sevran, France. A 72 year old woman, by the name of Francoise Aubert; 17 year old Virginie Tredaniel and a blind widow, Anne Chauvan formed the first "Little Sisters of The Poor."

By 1853, the Little Sisters of The Poor numbered about 500 Sisters. They were all over France, but also in England. Jeanne Jugan wrote a rule for herself and all the sisters which asked them to place aside personal pride and go out door to door asking for food, clothing and money for the poor.

In the convent Jeanne Jugan was known as "Mother Marie of the Cross". She went on to establish six more convents that paid special attention to the poor. In 1879, the year of her death, Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) gave approval to her Order, officially establishing the Little Sisters of The Poor.

At the time of her death in 1879 there were 2,400 Little Sisters of the Poor in the world. She died August 30, 1879 at the age of 87. She was declared "Blessed" by Pope St. John Paul II (1978-2005) on October 3, 1982. She was declared "saint" by Pope Benedict XVI (2005-2013) on October 11, 2009.

These are her very last words:

"O Mary, my dear Mother, come to me. You know I love you and how I long to see you."
After these words, she died very peacefully.
