

Hartford Priest Convocation

Each year the priests of the Archdiocese of Harford come together in a convocation, to listen, pray and deliberate. This year will be special to us as I am sure our coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne will be joining us. It is also gratifying to learn the status of the Archdiocese in Archbishop Blair's talk. The Priest's convocation will take place on October 2, 3, and 4, 2023. Since all priests are required to be present, there will not be a Mass celebrated on those days in the parish Church. Daily Mass will resume on October 5th with a regularly scheduled 9 a.m. mass. Please pray for all of us on the Priest's Convocation. Incidentally, since most of the parish churches in the Hartford Archdiocese may not be celebrating daily Mass, I suggest you may want to attend daily mass at St. Luke Church in Ellington, CT (Diocese of Norwich) at 8am.



Month of The Most Holy Rosary

Traditionally, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates October as the month of the Most Holy Rosary. The Feast Day of Our Lady of The Rosary is on October 7th. Rosaries are available to everyone in St. Catherine Church in the sanctuary. They are available at St. Philip Church below the Altar Rail. Hopefully you will recite the Rosary each day or at least offer a decade of the Rosary each day during October.

Our Lady of The Rosary

Since October is the month of the Rosary, it is proper to draw attention to the Feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary celebrated each year on October 7th.

In earlier days it was known as the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, in light of an unbloody victory of pushing back a Muslim invasion of Italy at Lepanto, Italy during the papacy of Pope St. Pius V in 1571.

Actually, the Rosary goes back to the Irish Monks who recited all the psalms on pebbles strung together on string. It was fully developed by St. Dominic and came to us as we know it by the Dominican, Alan de la Roche. He preferred the term: "Psalter of Our Lady: rather than the term, "Rosary." The Psalter of Our Lady refers to the many biblical aspects of the Rosary for many years or centuries ago, the daily prayer of priest and nuns was referred to as a "Psalter" (pronounced: salter. The "p" is silent). The only non-biblical mysteries of the Rosary would be found in the Glorious Mysteries. They are: "The Assumption of Mary into Heaven" and "The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth."

Meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, we are drawn to the holy life and example of Our Blessed Lady. Also, the mysteries of the Rosary are really the important moments in the life of Christ. Sometimes the Rosary is called, "A Bible on a String". The meditating mysteries of the Rosary are: The Joyful Mysteries; The Sorrowful Mysteries; The Glorious Mysteries and the Luminous Mysteries added by Pope John Paul II in the year 2002.
