

Divine Mercy

Through the good grace of the Father Nadolny Foundation we are the recipients of two Divine Mercy portraits that will hang on the outside of our two churches. These portraits measure 7' X 4 ' and are in full color, protected from all weather fronts and have a small mesh cage around the frame to prevent birds from nesting. They are lit up at night by solar lighting. They cost more than \$2,000 for the picture and installation. The Fr. Nadolny Foundation has already collected the money for the two portraits. Thus they are no cost to us!! They will also be installed at no cost to us!!

In her book: **Divine Mercy in My Soul**, St. Faustina writes that the Lord Jesus told her that anyone who places a picture of the Divine Mercy on the outside of the church or the home will be protected from sickness or diseases. I had them placed on two churches in Southington before the pandemic and had no one pass away from Covid-19. Please consider learning how to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily. St. Faustina is a very powerful intercessor in matters of health and especially kind to those who have a heart condition.
