

Advent II

In the Book of Genesis, we find that the first creation is that of LIGHT. Everything made by God is soaked in LIGHT.

God reveals Himself through the Scriptures. It is the way God makes Himself known to us. The *Light of God* is the story of God helping us to understand (see) God. Through the *light*, God communicates goodness for the created world. The LIGHT from heaven illumines our days unless we choose to reject God's *light*.

Fiat Lux in Latin means: "He made the light". (literal translation) Commonly it is translated: "Let there be light". In the Book of Isaiah 9:1 we read: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light!" In Advent, we await that LIGHT. As a matter of fact, the Christmas Carol: Silent Night's third verse says this: "Silent Night, Holy Night, Son of God; Love's pure light. Radiant beams from Thy Holy Face; with the dawn of redeeming grace. Jesus Lord at Thy birth; Jesus Lord at Thy birth". It all reflects the Light of God: radiant beams; the dawn (1st light of daytime) of redeeming grace.

The following is an Advent prayer by Fr. Henri Nouwen:

Lord Jesus.

Master of both the light and the darkness, send your Holy Spirit upon our preparations for Christmas. We who have so much to do seek quiet spaces to hear your voice each day. We who are anxious over many things look forward to your coming among us. We who are blessed in so many ways long for the complete joy of your kingdom. We whose hearts are heavy seek the joy of your presence.

We are your people walking in darkness yet seeking the LIGHT. To you we say:

"Come, Lord Jesus!!"
