

Feast Day of The Saints

Feast days are so named because in the early days of the Church there was an actual feast of foods and drink on the day of the saints. This past week we celebrated two feast days. The Annunciation of Mary (Monday, April 8th) and St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr (Thursday, April 11th).

The Annunciation is usually celebrated on March 25th. However, this year March 25th was Monday of Holy Week. Liturgically the Annunciation was moved to the first free day outside of the Easter Octave (March 31-April 7th). The Annunciation of Mary can only be found in Luke's Gospel (Lk.1:26-38).

The Annunciation by the Archangel Gabriel of Jesus' Incarnation is widely depicted in religious art. What Mary was doing at the time of the Angel Gabriel's arrival is not of the greatest importance, but of the utmost importance is the Message.

An Archangel comes to deliver several messages. <u>One</u> that Mary is "full of Grace"; <u>two</u> that she has been delivered of sin. She is free from sin and <u>thus</u> she will give birth to the Son of God.

Very important is Mary's humility. Really not understanding these events, her faith in God causes her to say:" Let it be done to me according to your word".

Every Catholic home should have a portrait (picture) of Mary in a special place or a small statue with a small candle as a reminder of what we should attain in our Christian faith.

Last week Thursday, April 11th we celebrated the Feast of St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr. He was the Archbishop of Krakow, Poland. Karol Wojtyla (John Paul 11) was the successor of St. Stanislaus when he was Archbishop of Krakow

Stanislaus Szczepankowski was born on the outskirts of Krakow in the year 1030. He was what we would call today a "change-of-life" baby. He studied for the priesthood in Paris, France. A very effective preacher he became the Archbishop of Krakow in 1072.

He was a good shepherd to all of his people especially the poor and was deeply caring of his priests. Daily, he made pastoral visitations to the sick and lonely.

At the time, the King of Poland was Boleslaus 11. He was morally corrupt and unfaithful. He was a courageous military man, who won many victories against the Russians, especially in Kiev. Eventually, Stanislaus excommunicated him. The King was enraged! He ordered the archbishop's assassination.

While celebrating Mass April 11,1079 in the Church of St. Michael in Krakow, he was assassinated by the King himself. He was laid to rest under a side altar in the Church of St. Michael. St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr was declared a "saint" by Pope Innocent 1V in 1253. Stanislaus is the first Polish saint to be recognized as a Martyr.

Incidentally, his relic is in the Ambry of St. Philip Church. The Ambry contains the oils used for Baptism and the Anointing of the sick.
