Church Regulations

The following are church regulations for sacraments. Sometimes the faithful inquire about these and it is good to review them every so often. You may wish to save them and place them in an area where you have easy access to them.

The first Sacrament is **BAPTISM**.

Because of church regulations, this sacrament seems to be most controversial when it comes to sponsors.

Any child can be Baptized. If the child is older and can reason, then we prepare the child for Baptism, so that they are aware of what is happening.

In Baptism, one must be registered in a parish church, though there are exceptions.

Sponsors:

Must be baptized.

Received their 1st Holy Communion Received their Confirmation and Be validly married by a priest or deacon (in the Roman Catholic Church).

** A sponsor may be living a,b & c and may be single. Christian Witness

This person may be of a <u>different Christian faith</u> other than Roman Catholic. This person is not a godfather/godmother but is a <u>Christian Witness</u>.

The Role of the Godparents are to step in when the parents are unable to teach the child in the Roman Catholic Faith. Therefore, one of the Godparents must be Catholic if parents are going to choose a Christian Witness.

The Church would not expect a Lutheran, Methodist, Anglican etc., to bring up a child in the Catholic Faith. With all due respect they are not Catholics and we would not expect them to learn Catholicism either. We respect them <u>and</u> their faith. Therefore, they are most welcome to be Christian Witnesses.

Also, for the same reason a Taoist, Buddhist, Muslim etc., cannot be sponsors (godparents) of a Christian baby, for reasons which are understandable.



The second Sacrament is Marriage

Unfortunately, many marriages don't take place in church anymore. Be that as it may, the Church still has certain regulations for the Sacrament of Marriage. Since everyone can now get "married", the Church has become fond of calling the sacrament... the sacrament of "matrimony." Not everyone can enter into the Sacrament of Matrimony. Even the official books have been changed to include the word "matrimony".

- 1. A person does not have to be registered in a parish in order to be married in a Church. However, one must live according to Canon law within a <u>Domicile</u>.
- 2. What is a Domicile? Let's say we live in Enfield, CT. Your Domicile will be a 10 –15-mile radius from Enfield. Thus, one could get married in a Church in Enfield, Windsor, East Windsor, South Windsor, Springfield, MA etc. WITHOUT being registered in a particular parish.

- 3. A prerequisite of Baptism would be acceptable, but the Church celebrates Matrimony of those who have not been Baptized. Mostly those weddings would be between a Catholic and a Jewish person or perhaps even a Muslim person. These would not be baptized as they are not Christian.
- 4. Roman Catholics must enter the State of Matrimony by a priest because in the Roman Catholic Church Matrimony is a Sacrament. That would not be true of our other Christian brothers and sisters, in most cases. For instance, matrimony is a sacrament in the Orthodox Church and the Anglican Church. The Roman Catholic party still needs permission from the Bishop to enter Matrimony in those Churches.
- 5. A Roman Catholic can be married in another denomination's Church but must obtain permission from the Roman Catholic Bishop to do so. The Roman Catholic priest must perform the matrimony as Matrimony is a Sacrament in the Roman Catholic Church, and the Catholic has to be sacramentally married.
- 6. The Church accepts, as valid, Protestant marriages between two Protestants.
