April 7, 2024 Divine Mercy Sunday

Pope St. John Paul II (1978-2005) instituted Divine Mercy Sunday on the second Sunday of Easter in the year 2000. It is a time in which we reflect upon God's unfathomable Mercy for all people of the world. This year's celebration will take place at St. Philip Church at 3:30 p.m. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin the hour with readings from the Scripture, The **Divine Mercy chaplet, a Eucharistic** procession of healing and Solemn **Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.** We are happy to welcome the Brothers from Cheshire (Legionaries of Christ) to join us that day as they did last year. Hoping to see all of you too.

On a personal Note

I think all of you would agree that our Holy Week liturgies at St. Maryanne Cope parish were very inspiring. There is nothing more inviting than to experience the Church looking so beautiful for this very special time of year. Mostly, it is you, the faithful who add so much to the Pascal Mysteries and the events of Holy Week.

Therefore, I extend a heartfelt thanks to all who attended the masses and two Good Friday Services. A special thank you to those who decorated the two Churches for Easter. I'm sure you agree that both are very beautiful.

Thank you to the Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, choir members, musicians and guest soloists who enhanced our special liturgies tremendously. Thank you to Deacon Alan for the tremendous help he gives to the parish and to me.

Please don't forget that we enjoy seven (7) weeks of Easter. As I've stated, any Catholic may go to confession anytime between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost Sunday. Catholics are only required to confess once-a-year. This is called an "Easter Duty."

Concerning the aforementioned paragraph, this year one can complete their Easter Duty between February 14th (Ash Wednesday) and May 19th (Pentecost) Sunday, which ends the Easter Season.

My hope is that all of you had a most enjoyable Easter Sunday with family and friends. May the Risen Lord continue to shower you with many graces.

St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) Apostle of Divine Mercy

As previously mentioned, St. Faustina Kowalska was declared a saint on April 30, 2000. The very first saint of the new millennium. On that day, St. John Paul II declared the Second Sunday of Easter: Divine Mercy Sunday.

St. Faustina's real name was Helena Kowalska. She was the third of ten children. Born August 25, 1905 in Glogowiec (gwogoviets) Poland, she only attended three years of school. As she grew older, she became a domestic servant for several families.

On August 1, 1925 she was invested into the Order of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw, Poland. The Order's Apostolate was the care and education of troubled young women. In her Order she served as a cook, gardener and porter (door-keeper). Her convent name was *Sister Maria Faustina of the Most Blessed Sacrament*.

Her deep spirituality was in honor of Mary, the Immaculate Mother of God, the Blessed Sacrament and Reconciliation (confession) which led her to a mystical life of prayer. She was a mystic. When mystics pray, they are not aware of the world around them, because they are one with God. St. John Paul II was a mystic. Priests have reported that in his private chapel at the Vatican he would utter soft groans during prayer.

Receiving messages in prayer from Jesus, she recorded over 700 pages of Christ's Mercy which became a book: <u>Divine Mercy in my Soul</u>. In these writings, Jesus emphasizes His Mercy and Forgiveness for sins acknowledged and confessed. Jesus told her: <u>"I do not want to punish mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart."</u>

In her revelations of Jesus she was told to be the messenger of Divine Mercy for the world. She was instructed to have an image painted with the inscription: "Jesus, I trust In You." The painting shows a red and white light coming from Christ's Sacred Heart. The two lights or rays represent the blood and water poured out after Jesus' death. (Jn:19:34.

Sinners are encouraged not to despair, nor to doubt God's willingness to forgive them if they repent.

St. Maria Faustina Kowalska died of tuberculosis in Krakow, Poland on October 5, 1938. St. John Paul II declared her a "blessed" on April 18, 1993. He declared her a "saint" on April 30, 2000.

May we come to know the love and mercy of Christ, which surpasses all human understanding.
