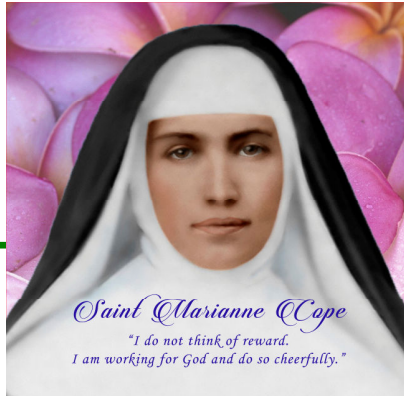

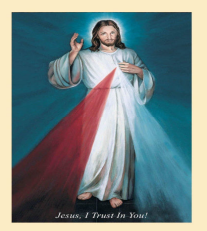

Sacrament of Matrimony (Marriage) Vital Information



In explaining Holy Matrimony I forgot to say that Matrimony is the only sacrament people give to themselves. In a very strict understanding the priest doesn't marry you. He performs the Wedding and takes the vows. **When are two people married?** When they consummate the marriage on the honeymoon.

The Sacrament of The Anointing of The Sick

Since the close of Vatican II in 1965, there seems to be much confusion over the name of this sacrament and its meaning. Most Catholics today know it as “Last Rites” or “Extreme Unction”.

We know that if someone was near death, the panic would be to call a priest. In most cases, it would be, unfortunately, the last minute. Of course, all the emotion is attached to it, too.

Surprise!! Since 1965 there is no such thing as “last rites” or “extreme unction”. The sacrament has been called: The Sacrament of the Anointing of The Sick.

In days of yore, this sacrament could be given to the dead. Witness the priest that went into Parkland Hospital in Dallas, TX on November 22, 1963 to administer last rites to President John F. Kennedy, after he was dead. His name was Fr. Oscar Huber a Vincentian priest.

Sacraments today cannot be administered to the dead. One must be alive. If one has expired before the priest arrives, then the priest will bless the body and offer prayers for the dead with the family.

Within the Anointing of the Sick is the forgiveness of sins. However, if the person is cognizant, he/she may be asked if they would like the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) before the anointing. If the person is not coherent then the priest will offer the forgiveness of sins as if the person had gone to Confession.

The Sacrament of The Anointing of The Sick is not “magic”! As it goes, none of the sacraments are magic! They are Jesus Christ dwelling in us. The priest simply acts as an agent of Christ, bestowing upon one or to one, the sacrament.

In the Sacrament of The Sick, the priest anoints the forehead and then the inside of the palms of the hand. When a priest is anointed by a priest; he is anointed on the forehead and the top of the hands, because his palms have already been anointed at his ordination.

The Feast of St. Philip May 3rd

The Feast of St. Philip occurs on May 3rd. Also St. Philip shares his Feast Day with St. James. These two were part of the twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus. Since St. Philip is a vital part of St. Marianne Cope Parish, our concentration will be about St. Philip.

St. Philip’s Feast Day has been celebrated since the 6th century (500’s) in the Church. His and St. James’ relics are in the Basilica of the Holy Apostles (Rome) since the year 560 A.D.

Called to follow Jesus, shortly after Jesus called Peter and his brother Andrew, Philip was born in Bethsaida in Galilee (Jn.1:44). Jesus’ call and strong gazing eyes caused Philip to respond immediately for he was certain that Jesus was the promised Messiah.

In Jn. 1:43-46 Philip approaches his friend Nathaniel to tell him that he, Philip, has encountered the one spoken of by Moses and all the prophets. This could be the Nathaniel whom Jesus saw under the fig tree (Jn. 1: 47-50) and the Nathaniel Jesus told, “you must be born again.” In any event Philip and Nathaniel were friends, according to what we glean from Scripture.

Also, in Jn.12: 20-22 the Greeks approved Philip and ask to see Jesus. It almost seems that Philip is an outside secretary to Jesus, if you will.

At the last Supper, Jesus addresses Philip with these words: “He who sees me sees the Father,” (Jn. 14:8-11) Philip preached the Gospel in Phrygia, which is still a city in modern day Turkey. Present day descendants of the Phrygians are the Armenians. Philip was martyred in Hierapolis in the south western part of Turkey. His body remained there until it was transferred to the Basilica of the Holy Apostles in Rome, in the year 560 A.D. We can find St. Philip in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. He can also be found in the Acts of the Apostles.

To that end we say: St. Philip, pray for us!!
