



## Regulations For Fasting and Abstinence

The Church teaches that Catholics in good health are to observe the following practices during Lent unless for some serious reason they are unable

to do so. From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: "Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory (mandated) days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory (mandated) days of abstinence.

T he norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Catholics from age 14 onwards."

## Film about St. Carlo Acutis

On Sunday, April 27, 2025 Carlo Acutis will be declared a saint along with Pier Giorgio Frassati in Rome. Carlo Acutis is pronounced: a-coo-tis. A movie about his life will be shown in 945 theaters across America on April 27, 28 and 29. Once 5,000 tickets are sold, the theaters have agreed to extend the movie about the life of Carlo Acutis three more days: April 30, May 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup>. Carlo Acutis will be known as the First Millennial Saint and is closely connected to Jesus' true presence in the Eucharist. Dying at the age of 15 in the year 2006 from Leukemia, he offered his sufferings for the Church and the intentions of Pope Benedict XVI (2005 - 2013). Incidentally, Carlo Acutis will be the first saint in the over 2000 year history of the Catholic Church, whose parents will be present at the Canonization.

## <u>Beautiful Hymns</u>

All hymns are a prayer and they tell a story. Our Protestant brothers and sisters possess some of the most beautiful soul stirring hymns of the Christian Church. We heard one last week in "The Old Rugged Cross". The lyrics are so magnificent; while singing, we were talking to that Cross in deep prayer. Another one of those hymns is: "O Love That Wilt Not Let Me Go."

Of course, Jesus' love will not let us go! Like the Prodigal Son in last week's Gospel where the father (God) runs to meet the son (us) and welcomes him back with a "love that will not let go."

> "O Love that wilt not let me go I rest my weary soul in thee; I give thee back the life I owe; that in thine ocean depths its flow, may richer fuller be." "O Cross that liftest up my head, I dare not ask to fly from thee; I lay in dust life's glory dead, and from the ground there blossoms red, Life that shall endless be."

Within the hymns there are profound meditations. These can be encountered by the Lenten hymns that bring us into the wounds and sufferings of Jesus Christ. The beauty of these are not only the lyrics, but also the poetry. We seemed to have lost so much in the modern, callous world; especially the beauty and goodness of God.
