



The Election of a Pope

When a pope passes, there were certain traditions that took place <u>before</u> the public was informed. I don't know if these traditions still exist, probably they do.

Once the pope has passed a small nonharming hammer is used on the forehead of the pope three times while asking, using the pope's baptismal name, questioning are you dead? This could have been a medieval practice when there were no coroners to declare the death of someone. Then the public is informed.

The chair of the pope is known as *"sede vacante"* or empty chair. The pope's name is no longer said in the Mass. The church prepares for a funeral and burial. The pope's ring is smashed. After the funeral, the pope is usually buried or entombed in Saint Peters Basilica. Where the pope rests is simply known as; *"the grotto."* Pope Francis is not the only pope who is buried outside Saint Peter's Basilica.

As a matter of fact, several popes are buried at Saint Mary Major Basilica – Rome, with Pope Francis; Pope Honorius III (1216-1227); Pope Nicholas IV (1288–1292); Pope Saint Pius V (1566–1572); Pope Sixtus V; (1585–1590); Pope Clement VIII (1592 – 1605); Pope Clement IX (1667–1669); Pope Francis (2013-2025).

Traditionally, the pope is buried with coins in the coffin of saints and *blesseds* that he declared during his papacy.

After the burial of the pope, there is a nine day mourning. In which the cardinals come to Rome for the conclave. A conclave is derived from the Latin words: cum = with, clave = key. The cardinals are locked into the Sistine Chapel until a pope is elected. A cardinal needs 2/3rds vote plus one to be elected. There will be 135 Cardinals. A 2/3rds will be about 90 cardinals, plus one. The cardinals will begin voting on May 7, 2025. Please pray for the success of the conclave.
