



Pope Leo XIV

This seems to be an ongoing series. However, that is good as now we learn more about the Holy Father who was born in Chicago, Illinois.

First of all, what a surprise!!! I never expected that announcement from the loggia of St. Peter's Basilica!! The rapid history most of us have lived through is mind boggling: the death of a pope in 33 days, a pope from Poland, a pope from Argentina and a pope from the United States and Peru! In many ways the Church has become truly "catholic". The word catholic is a Greek word meaning "universal."

Also unusual is that for a second time-in-a-row we have a pope from a religious order. Pope Francis was a Jesuit and Pope Leo XIV is an Augustinian. Both of these orders are strict, with an emphasis on obedience.

Having Religious Order experience makes one more spiritual and prayerful. As a matter of fact in Canon Law the religious orders are deemed a *higher calling* to the priesthood, because they live a life of spirituality and prayer. I began in a religious order with the Congregation of St. Vincent de Paul. I was a Religious Brother. To this day, I carry with me their charism and spirituality. Their primary focus was in teaching and evangelizing. I might say that I have met some Diocesan Priests that are very spiritual and prayerful, too.

The Augustinian Order is sometimes known as: "The Order of Hermits of St. Augustine." It was established in March of 1244 with the approval of Pope Innocent IV (1243–1254). They were established as a Mendicant (begging) Order. The Franciscans and the Dominicans are also Mendicant Orders. This means that they go out begging for food and water on behalf of the poor and themselves. The spirituality of the Order is grounded in the writings and teaching of St. Augustine; focusing on the interior search for God and living the monastic life. St. Augustine lived between 354–430. His famous writing is a book entitled: The Confessions. Other books by him are: The City of God and On the Trinity.
